



Message from the lay minister

ave you seen The Crown yet? It's a lavish, Netflixoriginal drama depicting the life of Queen Elizabeth II (Claire Foy) & Prince Philip (Matt Smith), and the series takes us through from 1940s to modern times. It's compelling viewing and you will get hooked immediately! In Episode 6 of the present (second) series depicting life in the Royal Family in the 1950s, the Queen is shown a secret war document revealing damning correspondence of her dear uncle, the Duke of Windsor. The letters reveal his fascist views and his strong support for appeasement prior to the Second World War. The Queen's knowledge of these papers is made all the more poignant by the Duke asking the Queen for her permission to re-enter British politics. On the one hand the Queen feels revulsion to his fascist views and on the other hand she feels love and loyalty towards a family member. There is a touching scene where the Queen, having listened to a sermon in Royal Windsor chapel, asks Billy Graham about forgiveness.

Did you see Billy Graham when he came to Bristol in May 1984? His message was clear and uncomplicated. He talked about a personal relationship with God, mediated through Jesus Christ, and he spoke, refreshingly, in a language everyone could understand. At each of his rallies, he invited each of *(Continued overleaf)* his audience to "get up out of your seat and accept Jesus Christ as your personal Saviour". More than 3.2 million people (over 58 years of crusades) accepted this offer. Billy Graham's team worked with local churches to guide new converts in their early Christian faith.

Billy Graham had boundless energy and preached at annual crusades spanning 1947 to 2005. His largest live audience was in 1973 to 1.3 million in Seoul, South Korea. His largest televised broadcast was in 1996 to an estimated 2.5 billion worldwide. He was unafraid to give a Christian view on political and social issues. During the Cold War he was the first evangelist to speak behind the Iron Curtain, addressing large crowds throughout Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union, always calling for peace.

During the apartheid era he consistently refused to visit South Africa until integrated seating for audiences was introduced. In his first crusade in South Africa he openly denounced apartheid. He corresponded with Nelson Mandela during his 27 years in jail. He was spiritual adviser to 12 presidents from Harry Truman (33rd) to Barack Obama (44th).

Billy Graham died at the age of 99 and 2,000 family and friends attended his funeral. It was Billy Graham's express wish that the funeral service reflect and reinforce the gospel message he preached for more than 60 years.

Looking Back ... to April 1995

In this issue of *Focal Point*, churchwarden John Underwood thanked Bill Jones for making a beautiful new hymn board.

There was this recipe for Easter Spring Lamb. Mix 2 tablespoons of oil, the juice of 1 lemon, 2 tablespoons of sesame seeds, 1 tablespoon of coriander seeds (crushed), 2 garlic cloves (crushed) & 2 pinches of cayenne pepper.

Take 4 lamb neck fillets (6oz each) and place in a roasting pan. Rub in spice mix and cover with foil. Keep in a cool place and rub in the spices several times for a few hours. Heat the oven to 475F, remove the foil and cook the lamb at the top of the oven for 15-20 minutes. It should still be slightly pink inside. Serve with new potatoes, minty peas and the pan juice.

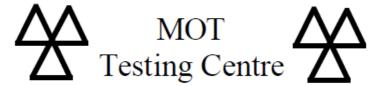
