



Message from the lay minister

ou only have to say the word 'August' and my mind pictures seaside holidays. It all goes back 70 years when the highlight of our family year saw us heading for Woolacombe, the Scilly Isles or the Isle of Arran. The whole family together, no school or work and lots of swimming. Pretty cold it was too in the pre-wet suit era.

The excited anticipation lasted right through my working life. Coming home from the office on a Friday evening in May saying '12 weeks tomorrow we will be on the way to Arran' was greeted with some amusement by the rest of the family.



Summer entertainment

une began with Roughshod and ended with And There Was Music, writes Nicola Bennetts.
Roughshod is the current show created by five members of the Riding Lights Travelling Theatre Company – five young actors with a very few props and a lot of energy.

A couple of screens did service as walls, doorways and notice boards; metal stools became cages, coffins and percussion instruments, whilst a few hats created a cast of different characters.

They segued from satire to straight storytelling and from music to mime in a series of sketches with songs, fast-paced dialogue and silent tableaux, often funny and sometimes very moving.

But could they, an evangelical Christian group, deliver an overtly religious message at the same time as entertaining us? Well, yes, they carried it off with panache, making us laugh, pause for thought and laugh again.

One of the most affecting pieces was their dramatic rendering of a true story about an unprovoked attack on an Amish community. The audience was silent and still as the actors showed how the Amish people sought no revenge, instead offering friendship to their attackers.

Andrew, Jared, Martha, Esther and Bethia gave us a memorable evening at the beginning of June and Ben Stock gave us another at the end of the month with *And There Was Music*.

Ben has performed in theatres and nightclubs from New York to Kuala Lumpur as well as venues all over the UK. He's used to audiences 3,000 strong, as well as more intimate gatherings, but cabaret in a church was a first for him.

The new space at the west end was ideal for the social event and Ben made the most of the acoustics, filling the

church with the sound of his voice.

Sometimes accompanying himself on the keyboard, and sometimes working with Harry, his pianist, Ben wowed Bitton with his mix of songs from the shows interspersed with anecdotes about his theatrical career.

With local roots – he grew up in Wick – he established a warm rapport with the audience who were delighted when he promised to return one day.

In the meantime many bought copies of his CD as a reminder of a wonderful evening.

Roadworks update

Work started in early July on a major drainage and flood protection project on the A4175 Cherry Garden Road and A431 Bath Road in Bitton.

The scheme is estimated to take up to three months. So far the work has involved temporary traffic lights at times and South Glos Council anticipates that during the latter part of August, different sections of these roads will need to be closed at different times in order to carry out the works safely.

While road closures are in place, diversion routes will be signed. Access for residents and businesses in Cherry Garden Road and Bath Road will be maintained.

Several trees which were causing root ingress damage to the drainage pipes have been removed. The work has been done in close liaison with the council's own arboricultural team and none of the trees were subject to protection orders.

Man prosecuted over waste dumped in Bitton

A man from Wick has been ordered to pay a £230 fine and £300 in court costs after pleading guilty to failing to make sure waste from his property was properly disposed of.

Richard Short, 38, of Naishcombe Hill, was prosecuted by South



Gloucestershire Council's environmental protection team after a member of the public reported four bags of household waste, including bottles and tins, fly tipped in Church Road, Bitton.

Evidence from the waste led back to Mr Short who confirmed that the waste belonged to him.

Whilst claiming that he had paid for it to be removed, the court was satisfied that he had failed in his duty of care to dispose of the waste properly.

South Gloucestershire Council's Cabinet Member for Communities and Tourism, Cllr Paul Hughes, said: "We have a 100% record of securing successful prosecutions for this type of offence, so if you allow your rubbish to be fly tipped by failing to ensure it is correctly removed in South Glos, you can expect to be caught and prosecuted."

Residents are advised to only give their rubbish to an Environment Agency registered waste carrier.

Unwanted goods and household or garden waste can all be disposed of at no cost via the council's Sort It centres.

Bitton WI report

fter the minutes were read by Lesley Brain at our July meeting, Ann Coales thanked Georgina Bond and her team for organising the June meeting.

She then introduced the evening speaker, James Adington, who gave us the history of blue glass. The first evidence of man-made glass was made over 4,000 years ago, small glass beads. Then 2,000 years later the Egyptians made tubes by pulling the hot glass. The Romans made honey pots by blowing, they were the first people to bring it to Britain.

At that time we were making fake Roman coins in the Mendips, that is why the came in the first place. We were only able to make green glass, and then in 1672 George Ravenscroft added lead and white glass was made. Bristol Blue glass was made popular by Isaac Jacobs. It went out of fashion but was brought back in 1988 by James Adllington.

The next day we went on a group outing to Knebworth House in Hertfordshire, home of the Litton family for over 500 years. As the house appears at the end of a long driveway, it looks like a Gothic castle. It is well known for rock concerts and filming, *The Shooting Party* being one of them.

Walking around the lovely grounds we came upon the dinosaur trail in the wilderness garden with 72 life-size dinosaurs and prehistoric creatures grazing among the shrubbery, My favourites were the mammoths. It was a lovely day out and well worth a visit.

We don't have a meeting in August so our next one will be on Monday 10th September. The Flower Club meets on the third Tuesday in the month.
