



From the Honorary Curate

s the summer holidays are drawing to an end, parents with schoolaged children will get ready for the beginning of a new academic year, as will those who work in schools or universities.

Even for those of us who haven't got children at school or are otherwise linked to the academic year, September still is the beginning of something new, a new phase or the returning to the routine. July and August often don't follow regular patterns, lots of people are on holiday.

This year, we had a particularly good summer: lots of sunshine (though I acknowledge the need for rain), a good football World Cup (if you are English), lots of opportunities for yummy barbecues or long walks.

Now, with September about to start, we are reminded that the summer is drawing to a close, even though at the time of writing this, there have been some articles predicting warm weather all the way until the end of September.

Holidays are over, it is back to normality - back to a routine. Back to the ordinary life, maybe. There is nothing wrong with

ordinary life, in fact in the Church year we are still in ordinary time for a few months.

I'd like to encourage us to embrace the routine, the mundane. St Benedict, the founder of a monastic order, felt that one of the great spiritual lessons was to keep the connections between the spiritual aspects of our lives and the daily tasks set before us. 'Ritualising those tasks, in other words, making them a living prayer to be performed with intentionality, meant that we could live ordinary lives extraordinary well. Ritualising the task of doing the dishes and setting the table can become opportunities to worship. Through this practice we make the present moment of how we are living holy. We find layers and layers of meaning as the endless days of tasks unfold and we dig deeper into the truth of being ordinary...whether we pull weeds, wash dishes, it is holy as we remember we are in God's presence as we work at each task.' (Becca Stevens, 89, 2015)

I really like the idea of living the ordinary life extraordinary well - maybe that's we can do this September: live the ordinary time in the Church calendar extra ordinary well.

Yes, there might be no festival (apart from the Patronal Festival at the beginning of the month), but there is always to opportunity of being intentional in our tasks, the way we serve, the way we approach work, the way we relate to friends and family.

A book I read in the last couple of years is Everyday God, by Paula Gooder, which I have mentioned in the past - in it, she explores the longest period of the liturgical year which is ordinary time, 33 weeks where no great dramas occur. In a culture where we value the special, the new, the unusual, 'the ordinary' is the very essence of life.

So this month, rather than get down by having to go back to routine and our ordinary life, let us learn how to live an ordinary life in an extraordinary way.


